<ul> <li>Euclid shared that they've learned numerous families in one grade level expressed the need for counseling when the district was making personal calls after a student death; but now they are struggling with how to move forward with this data – buildings not adequately staffed to tackle these needs</li> <li>If districts want data reports broken down by specifics (i.e. grade level, etc.) contact CWRU and those reports will be created &amp; shared</li> <li>YMHFA</li> <li>Data only shows training for the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of this year (Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> – Dec. 31<sup>st</sup> of 2017)</li> <li>362 total people trained</li> <li>Mini-grants</li> <li>No updates from Euclid or providers</li> <li>Parma running small groups at TPE with consultation funds (start in March)</li> <li>System Navigator / HB 410</li> <li>SN continues to collaborate with Fairview Hospitals to help support youth/families with concerns related to school (ie. bullying, exploring accommodations/Special Education, etc.)</li> <li>We meet recently with Fairview Hospital to follow up on referrals and needs. From November – January there were 6 referrals; however over the last month referrals have doubled.
