Peer role models must be screened and meet guidelines for age appropriate speech, cognition, and social/emotional behaviors. All three of our special needs classrooms have a morning and afternoon session. Morning Session: 8:45am -11:30am. Afternoon Session: 12:45pm-3:30pm We have one ECE preschool classroom for families who meet income eligible guidelines. This is a general education classroom. Students with special needs can receive services within the classroom, if this is considered their least restrictive environment; however, most of the students within this classroom do not have a special need. This classroom is for students who are four years old by August 1st of the current school year. Exceptions are made for special needs students; if there is space in the classroom, a special needs student may enroll in the classroom whenever he/she turns four years of age. A special needs student does not have to meet income eligible guidelines. All students must reside in the district and proof of residency is required. Transportation is provided for special needs students only. We also added a second classroom supported by UPK and it is full day, for 4 years and up.</p>
