



Administration and Scoring of the Alternate Assessment for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities

The Alternate Assessment for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities (AASCD) is the statewide achievement test aligned with Ohio's Learning Standards-Extended (OLS-E) for Science, Social Studies, Mathematics, and English/Language Arts. The AASCD is an individually administered, computer based assessment. Participants in this professional development opportunity will learn how to organize the test materials and the testing environment; make accommodations to the test materials; administer the new assessment; and score the new assessment. Participants will also have an opportunity to interact with sample test materials and practice test administration.
