Enhancing equity in School-wide Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (SWPBIS) involves ensuring all students have equal access to support within the school system. This is crucial because it ensures that every student receives the necessary resources to succeed, irrespective of their cultural identities. To promote equity in SWPBIS, educators must ensure that SWPBIS systems are culturally responsive to the students intended to serve.

This two-day series will provide educators with knowledge and skills on integrating culturally responsive practices into SWPBIS implementation efforts to enhance equitable outcomes. Each session will cover a range of practices, such as

- using data to improve equity-focused decisionmaking,
- minimizing educators' biases,
- culturally responsive multi-tiered support of systems (MTSS),
- and alternatives to suspensions.
